HPL Highlights Pullman Porter

The Hammond Public Library's African American History Month program is Tues., Feb. 20 at 6:30 p.m. David Peterson, executive director of the National A. Philip Randolph Pullman Porter Museum, discusses Pullman porters as well as A. Philip Randolph, organizer of the Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters, the first predominantly African American labor union.

The museum is based just across the state line in Chicago's Pullman community. That is where George M. Pullman, after the Civil War, built a town to house employees for his railroad car company. Once his company built the cars, formerly enslaved men were hired as porters to serve passengers.

The work was neverending, as porters could be called upon at any time to shine shoes, carry luggage, turn down beds, and perform other tasks. Almost all porters were African American, while almost all supervisors were white. The pay was low, but it still was higher than many other African Americans were earning. Porters suffered the indignity of being called "George" — no matter their actual name — because they worked for George Pullman's company. The porters were instrumental in establishing a Black middle class in America. Union members fought for better working conditions, better pay, and civil rights.



Hammond Historical Tidbits

William H. GOSTLIN was one of the most successful businessmen in Hammond, no wonder they named a street after him. He was born in Canada on Christmas day, 1852. His wife Mary Ann Hyslop, was born in Whales, England on Nov. 28, also in 1852. While living in Chicago in 1879, their only son Harvey W. Gostlin was born and the industrious Marcus M. Towle came into their lives. In 1882 Marcus convinced Gostlin to join him in the venture of the M. M. Towle Distilling & Syrup Plant and move to Hammond. After plant burnt to the ground after only five years, Gostlin quickly switched to the lucrative waterway dredging business. This venture proved to be very profitable since the Hammond Meat Packing Plant was throwing all its waste, including cattle carcasses, into Grand Calumet River causing the busy river traffic to come to a halt. When the "World's Columbian Exposition of 1893" was being built in Chicago, Gostlin won the contract to work dredging the marshy grounds of Jackson and Washington Parks to create the specular lagoons, ponds, and Venetian canals designed to entice the world to come to the fair.

After that undertaking, Gostlin contracted out his dredging company to help with the construction of the "Chicago Drainage Canal". Dredging of the main canal started in 1892 and was designed to keep Chicago sewage out of Lake Michigan and discharge

it into the tributaries of the Illinois River. The system, which opened in 1900, was to safeguard the lake water supply from being contaminated with the city sewage being discharged extremely close to the drinking water intakes. We still see part of that early system today, known as the Cal Sag Canal.

William Gostlin, his son Harvey and best friend Peter Meyn organized the real estate firm of Gostlin, Meyn, & Co., laying out new housing additions to the city, including the exclusive area around Harrison Park. Their company was instrumental in rebuilding the city after the disastrous fire of 1902, totally destroying the entire acreage of the Hammond Meat Packing Plant. He was one of the first City councilmen, served as State Senator from 1895 to 1897 and was the Hammond Postmaster from 1902 to 1910. William H. Gostlin helped to attract and keep businesses in Hammond by starting the Hammond Commercial Club, predecessor of the Hammond Chamber of Commerce.

He died of a heartache on Nov. 28, 1916 at the age of 63, his wife Mary died 4 years later, they are buried at Oak Hill Cemetery joined by son Harvey W. and wife Nellie.

The recipients are Brittany Lynn Anderson of Bishop Noll and Malcolm Lang of Gavit.

Hall of Fame festivities begin at 5 p.m. with a social time. Dinner is at 6:30 p.m.; the induction program follows at 7:30.

Retired City Engineer Passes Away

It is with great sadness to report that Stan Dostatni, City Engineer for forty years, passed away suddenly on Sunday, February 4th. Stan leaves behind his wife Nancy, son Mike, daughter Becky and his sister Sandi.

Stan was quick with a smile and kind word which left an impact on everyone he met. His vast knowledge made him the go-to person with questions regarding a multitude of subjects ranging from crossword puzzle answers, flooding issues, structural problems, etc. He was always willing to share his knowledge and wisdom with others. If he didn't know the answer, which was rare, he was quick to find the answer.

Stan was employed with the City of Hammond for forty years before retiring December 31, 2015. He began his career in 1976 as Office Engineer. Several years later he was promoted to Assistant City Engineer and finally City Engineer in 1988.

Mr. Dostatni was an exceptional man who gave his all to the City. "Stan is one of the most knowledgeable people I've known, especially when it comes to our city's streets and sewers," stated Mayor McDermott. "He was instrumental in having all but 160 homes/structures removed from the flood plain in Hammond saving residents millions of dollars in flood insurance premiums."

Stan was constantly watching the weather forecast for heavy rain events or walking the levy along the Little Calumet River to monitor

its effectiveness to save homes from flooding in Hammond. "In 2008, Stan was the first person to realize we were going to have a problem with the Little Calumet River flooding," stated Mayor McDermott. "In fact, due to his quick thinking, Stan was instrumental in saving the Schleicher neighborhood while other communities suffered million dollars of in damages."

Over the years, Stan worked on more projects than can be counted such as the bike bridges and trails; street projects and working with the Sanitary District to reduce basement backups just to name a few.

"Stan was one of the most influential people of my professional career", stated Chris Moore, NIES Engineering. "I worked with Stan and the Engineering Department for over twenty years and I am a better engineer for having known him."

"While we grieve the loss of Stan, his passion and fingerprints will live on in all the plans, projects and improvements that he oversaw in Hammond," stated John Kennedy, American Structurepoint. "He delivered on the vision of the current and previous administrations. He will be missed, but his legacy will always be remembered.

"We are in mourning at City Hall, stated Mayor McDermott. "All employees share with Stan's family and friends the immense sadness of his death. Our thoughts and prayers are with his family."
