Hammond Celebrates 9th Annual Veteran Appreciation Day Parade

Mayor Thomas M. McDermott, Jr. and the City of Hammond will celebrate its 9th Annual Veteran Appreciation Day parade on Saturday, November 5th at 10 a.m. in Hammond's 5th and 6th Districts. The parade route travels from Olcott Avenue, down 173rd Street and ends at the Hessville Park Veterans Memorial.

Some of the parade participants include members of local American Legions and VFW posts, musical entertainment from area high school bands, military vehicles, Those Funny Little People, and a flyover by the Lima Lima Flight Team.

This year's Grand Marshal is Sergeant Boyzie Coulter, U.S. Marine Corps. Boyzie enlisted in U.S. Marine Corps in February of 1983. He served 12 years from February of 1983 to June of 1995, and attained the rank of Sergeant. Sergeant Coulter served several tours including Operation Just Cause (Security operation in Panama), Operation Desert Shield/Operation Desert Storm (liberation of Kuwait in Southwest Asia), Operation Sea Angel (humanitarian efforts in Bangladesh, India), Operation Quick Draw/Continue Hope (Somalia, Africa), Operation Cease-fire Campaign and Red Reef V (Southwest Asia).

During Boyzie's time in the U.S. Marine Corps, he worked as a Nuclear Weapons Security Guard, Fire Team Leader / Squad Leader / Marksmanship Instructor, Squad Leader/Platoon Guide, Drill Instructor, and Platoon Sergeant. Boyzie was hired into the Hammond Police Department in February of 1997, and has served as a Field Training Officer, Evidence Technician, and on the SWAT Team. He was awarded Officer of the Year in 2000 and 2013. Boyzie currently serves as a Master Patrol Sergeant in the Patrol Division. He has been married to his wife, Robin, for over 37 years and they have three adult children.

Schedule of Events and Details Released for Humane Indiana Wildlife



More than 500 people are expected to attend the upcoming Humane Indiana Festival of Owls on Saturday, October 22, 2022. 2022 Festival of Owls is presented by Lerner & Rowe and Cleveland-Cliffs. Festival of Owls participants can meet live owls representing species native to Indiana. Many of these owls are part of Humane Indiana Wildlife's Ambassador Animal program. These previously

injured or orphaned owls were rehabilitated by HIW but cannot survive on their own and receive lifetime care at the Wildlife Rehabilitation and Education Center in Valparaiso. Other birds of prey will also be present.

The event kicks off with a VIP experience at 9 am and concludes at 4 pm. The day's schedule includes:

- **10:00 am**, "Owl Powers," Courtney Rearick, Humane Indiana Wildlife Educator, will discuss the adaptations that make owls unique
- **11:00 am**, "Meet the Owls: Part 1," Nicole Harmon, Humane Indiana Wildlife Director, will show some of the owls that are Ambassador Animals permanently being cared for by Humane Indiana at the Rehabilitation and Education Center
- **12:00 pm**, lunch
- **12:30 pm**, "Tracking Owls," Brad

Baumgardner, Indiana Audubon Society, will discuss the use of Motus tracking in the state of Indiana • **1:30 pm**, "Barn Owl Box Workshop," Amy Kearns, Indiana Department of Natural Resources, will speak about endangered barn owl populations in Indiana and host a workshop to make boxes for DNR • **2:30 pm**, "Meet the Owls, Part 2," Nicole Harmon will show the remaining owls that are Humane Indiana's Ambassadors and share natural history about owls and their care

• Festival of Owls will also feature a local artisan and vendor marketplace and an expanded kids' activity and arts center, thanks in part to support from the Indiana Arts Commission.

Tickets for the event are \$25 for adults, \$10 for children, and free for children ages 7 and under,

and can be purchased at www.humaneindiana.org.

Sponsorships are still available and range from \$5,000 to \$500 at www.humaneindiana.org. Vendor booths are also available online.

"Festival of Owls has something for everyone – the chance to meet owls and see them up close, activities for kids, workshops for naturalists, education for owl lovers, and the chance to marvel at Indiana's natural history," said Nicole Harmon, Humane Indiana Wildlife Director.

Each year HI impacts more than 25,000 animals and 50,000 people in northwest Indiana through HI's shelter/adoption center, clinic, pet food/supply pantry, foster care, animal homelessness prevention initiatives, and wildlife rehabilitation center.

Mikhail Gorbachev wins Nobel Peace Prize



Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev wins the Nobel Peace Prize for his work in ending Cold War tensions. Since coming to power in 1985, Gorbachev had undertaken to concentrate more effort and funds on his domestic reform plans by going to extraordinary lengths to reach foreign policy understandings with the noncommunist world.

Some of his accomplishments include four summits with President Ronald Reagan, including a 1987 meeting at which an agreement was reached to dismantle the U.S. and USSR intermediate-range missiles in Europe. He also began to remove Soviet troops from Afghanistan in 1988 and exerted diplomatic pressure on Cuba and Vietnam to remove their forces from Angola and Kampuchea (Cambodia), respectively. In a 1989 meeting with President George Bush, Gorbachev declared that the Cold War was over.

Gorbachev also earned the respect of many in the West through his policy of non-intervention in the political upheavals that shook the Eastern European “satellite” nations during the late-1980s and early-1990s. When Czechoslovakia, East Germany, Poland, and other Iron Curtain countries began to move toward more democratic political systems and free market economies, Gorbachev kept Soviet intervention in check. (This policy did not extend to the Soviet republics; similar efforts by Lithuania and other republics were met with stern warnings and force to keep the Soviet Socialist Republics together.)

Gorbachev was born in Privolnoye, Stavropol Krai, to a poor peasant family of Russian and Ukrainian heritage. Growing up under the rule of Joseph Stalin, in his youth he operated combine harvesters on a collective farm before joining the Communist Party, which then governed the Soviet Union as a one-party state according to the prevailing interpretation of Marxist-Leninist doctrine. Studying at Moscow State University, he married fellow student Raisa Titarenko in 1953 and received his law degree in 1955. Moving to Stavropol, he worked for the Komsomol youth organization and, after Stalin’s death, became a keen proponent of the de-Stalinization reforms of Soviet leader Nikita Khrushchev. Gorbachev died in August 30 2022, at the age of 91.

How to donate blood

Simply download the American Red Cross Blood Donor App, visit RedCrossBlood.org, call 1-800-RED CROSS (1-800-733-2767) or enable the Blood Donor Skill on any Alexa Echo device to make an appointment or for more information. All blood types are needed to ensure a reliable supply for patients. A blood donor card or driver’s license or two other forms of identification are required at check-in. Individuals who are 17 years of age in most states (16 with parental consent where allowed by state law), weigh at least 110 pounds and are in generally good health may be eligible to donate blood. High school students and other donors 18 years of age and younger also have to meet certain height and weight requirements.

Blood and platelet donors can save time at their next donation by using RapidPass® to complete their pre-donation reading and health history questionnaire online, on the day of their donation, before arriving at the blood drive. To get started, follow the instructions at RedCrossBlood.org/RapidPass or use the Blood Donor App.

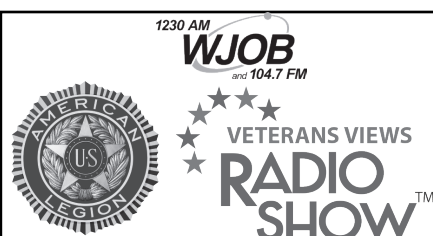

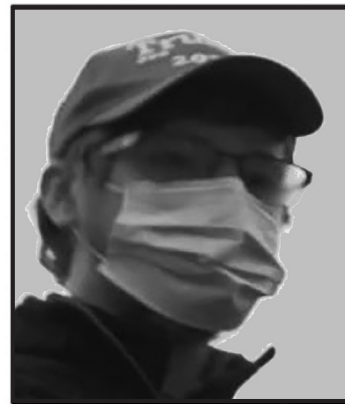
