

THIS DAY IN HISTORY JULY 1, 1979

The first Sony Walkman goes on sale

The transistor radio was a technological marvel that put music literally into consumers' hands in the mid-1950s. It was cheap, it was reliable and it was portable, but it could never even approximate the sound quality of a record being played on a home stereo. It was, however, the only technology available to onthe-go music lovers until the Sony Corporation sparked a revolution in personal electronics with the introduction of the first personal stereo cassette player. A device as astonishing on first encounter as the cellular phone or digital camera would later be, the Sony Walkman went on sale for the very first time on July 1, 1979.

The Sony Walkman didn't represent a breakthrough in technology so much as it did a breakthrough in imagination. Every element of the Walkman was already in production or testing as part of some other device when Sony's legendary chairman, Masaru Ibuka, made a special request in early 1979. Ibuka was a music lover who traveled frequently, and he was already in the habit of carrying one of his company's "portable" stereo tape recorders with him on international flights. But the Sony TC-D5 was a heavy device that was in no way portable by modern standards, so Ibuka asked his thendeputy Norio Ohga if he could cobble together something better. Working with the company's existing Pressman product—a portable, monaural tape recorder that was popular with journalists— Ohga had a playback-only stereo device rigged up in time for Ibuka's next trans-Pacific flight.

Even though this proto-Walkman required large, earmuff-like headphones and custom-made batteries (which, of course, ran out on Ibuka midway through his flight), it impressed the Sony chairman tremendously with its sound quality and portability. Many objections were raised internally when Ibuka began his push to create a marketable version of the device, the biggest of which was conceptual: Would anyone actually buy a cassette device that was not for recording but only for playback? Ibuka's simple response—"Don't you think a stereo cassette player that you can listen to while walking around is a good idea?"—proved to be one of the great understatements in business history.

After a breakneck development phase of only four months, Sony engineers had a reliable product ready for market at 30,000 Yen (approximately US \$150 in 1979 dollars) and available before the start of summer vacation for Japanese students—both critical targets established at the outset of development. The initial production run of 30,000 units looked to be too ambitious after one month of lackluster sales (only 3,000 were sold in July 1979). But after an innovative consumermarketing campaign in which Sony representatives simply approached pedestrians on the streets of Tokyo and gave them a chance to listen to the Walkman, the product took off, selling out available stocks before the end of August and signaling the beginning of one of Sony's greatest success stories.

City of Hammond Awarded \$7M Federal Grant for Governor's Parkway Railroad Overpass Project

The City of Hammond is the recipient of a \$7 million Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) grant that will support construction of a new railroad overpass and eliminate two conflict points where local roads intersect with railroad tracks. The funded infrastructure improvement effort, known as the Governor's Parkway Railroad Overpass Project, is targeted at providing a safe, efficient crossing where train blockages most impact existing surface streets in Hammond.

"Railroad stoppages in Hammond have been a problem in our city for over a century and we are finally getting the opportunity to fix it once and for all," said Mayor Tom McDermott. "I want to thank Secretary Buttigieg and the Department of Transportation as well as our state partners including Governor Holcomb and INDOT for making this funding available. This is a project that will improve quality of life and place for our community now and for future generations of Hammond residents."

The Governor's Parkway Railroad Overpass Project will focus primarily on the southeast area of Hammond, where stopped trains have had the greatest impact. Once completed, the overpass will be provide a bridge so travelers can bypass a busy railroad corridor that has been plagued by trains that stop for hours and sometimes days on end. The overpass is also slated to include a shared-use path for pedestrians and cyclists, and the structure will also help fire and police response times in the Hessville section of the city.

Funding for the \$7,029,392 grant was made possible through the U.S. Department of Transportation FRA Railroad Crossing Elimination (RCE) Grant Program, the first dedicated grant program to help communities eliminate atgrade crossings, which have, according to the FRA, "blocked vehicle and pedestrian traffic, led to deadly vehicle-rail collisions, and prevented first responders from reaching emergencies." These funds will be added to the funding already awarded to the City of Hammond through INDOT's Local Trax program.

"My administration has been relentless in its pursuit of overcoming the ripple-effect of railroad congestion in our community," said Mayor McDermott. "The Governor's Parkway Railroad Overpass Project will provide a safe passage solution making Hammond safer and improving our community."

Construction activities for the Governor's Parkway Railroad Overpass Project are expected to commence in 2024

Purdue University Northwest names Bruce Berdanier as dean of the College of Engineering and Sciences

Berdanier most recently served as the Lohr Endowed Dean of the Jerome J. Lohr College of Engineering at South Dakota State University (SDSU) in Brookings, S.D. As dean at SDSU, Berdanier's accomplishments included the completion of a \$5 million endowment for the dean's position, developing and implementing a strategic plan for the college and its departments, and engaging alumni, industries and partner universities in development of the region surrounding the university.

Since 2018, he has been actively engaged with the Engineering Accreditation Commission for the Accreditation Board of Engineering and Technology (ABET), leading accreditation teams evaluating universities' programs.

"Dr. Berdanier is a respected scholar with significant experience in engineering nationally and internationally, leadership and service in the engineering profession, teaching and research," said Kenneth C. Holford, provost and vice chancellor for Academic Affairs at PNW. "I am excited that he will join us at PNW, where he will continue to enhance the excellence of our engineering and science academic programs and engage our outstanding faculty and students in projects that improve the quality of life for people in the Northwest Indiana region and beyond."

At PNW, Berdanier will lead a college offering more than 20 undergraduate and graduate programs that prepare students for rewarding careers in the highly soughtafter STEM fields. The ABET-accredited programs of the PNW School of Engineering are a part of the College of Engineering and Sciences. The PNW School of

Engineering is recognized for its expertise in mechanical, civil, computer, and electrical engineering. The school ranks 42nd nationally in the most recent U.S. News and World Report rankings of Best Engineering Programs in the United States, among engineering schools whose highest degree is a bachelor's or master's degree.

As dean, Berdanier also will oversee several highly distinguished research centers including the Center for Innovation through Visualization and Simulation (CIVS), the Integrative Physiology and Health Sciences Center, the Center for Crime and Forensics, the Water Institute, the Energy Efficiency and Reliability Center, and the Center for High Energy Physics.

Berdanier previously served as the dean of the School of Engineering at Fairfield University in Fairfield, Conn. His faculty appointments have included South Dakota State, Ohio Northern University and South Dakota School of Mines and Technology.

He earned his Ph.D. in environmental engineering and hydrogeology from The Ohio State University, his master's degree in civil engineering with a concentration in environmental engineering from Purdue University in West Lafayette, and his bachelor's degree in

civil engineering with a concentration in water resources from The Ohio State University.


